


Articulation agreement between the Albert Dorman Honors College (ADHC) at NJIT and the Bergen
Community College Honors Program (BCCHP)

NJIT and BCCHP wish to provide an opportunity for students to move seamlessly from BCCHP into the ADHC. To that end, the two organizations agree to the following terms and conditions related to this articulation.

1. All students who complete four full-time semesters, or the equivalent as part-time students, in the honors program at Bergen Community College, and who meet the GPA requirements below, upon admission to NJIT as a transfer student and application to the ADHC, will be automatically admitted to the ADHC.
2. Such students must meet the following grade requirements in their Bergen courses:
 - a. GPA of at least 3.0 in Honors courses (4-point scale).
 - b. Overall GPA of at least 3.2.
3. All Honors courses taken at BCCHP with a grade no lower than B will be granted credit by the ADHC towards meeting the Lower Division/Major-Related requirement of eight courses. One Honors course grade of C will be accepted if it is balanced by an A in another Honors course.
4. If students transferring from BCCHP have taken fewer than eight Honors courses, they will be required to make up the deficiency in their first two semesters at NJIT. This may be done in any of the following ways:
 - a. By taking additional Honors courses at NJIT as defined in the Lower Division and Major Course Requirements section of the ADHC Requirements (attached) in effect at the time of the student's acceptance into the ADHC;
 - b. By taking upper-division Honors courses beyond those required in the Upper Division Requirements section of the ADHC Requirements; or
 - c. The student may declare a minor or second major, and any courses taken specifically and only to meet the requirements for that minor or second major are counted toward the lower-division Honors requirement.
 - d. Any graduate courses taken while the student is an undergraduate are also counted toward the lower-division Honors requirement.
 - e. There is a limit of **four** minor, second-major, and graduate courses that may be substituted for Honors courses.
5. If any of the requirements imposed on ADHC students during their first two years are modified subsequent to the signing of this agreement, BCCHP transfer students will be held to the revised requirements. Any BCCHP transfer student accepted into the ADHC under this agreement shall be bound by the requirements in effect at the time of acceptance.
6. Students transferring from BCCHP will meet all subsequent requirements of the ADHC for their remaining years at NJIT, as specified in the Honors Requirements. These include:
 - a. The specified Upper-Division Honors courses
 - b. Senior project as defined in Section III.A of the ADHC Requirements
 - c. Campus or Community Service
 - d. Attendance at two Colloquia per semester while at NJIT
 - e. Reporting and Communication Requirements
7. Transfer students from BCCHP will receive the same Honors scholarship given to other students who enter the ADHC after their first semester.
8. Transfer students from BCCHP will receive the same Honors diploma upon graduation as other NJIT students who meet Honors requirements by their graduation date.

9. A group of currently-offered BCCHP Honors courses has been reviewed by NJIT faculty who regularly teach Honors courses, and found to be at an appropriate level for Honors courses offered by ADHC. The list of such courses is attached as Appendix A. Some of these courses have ADHC equivalents and some do not, but all will be accepted by the ADHC as Honors courses. This list is not intended to be exclusive or definitive, but rather as representative. This list will be updated periodically as deemed necessary by both parties.
10. This Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2004, with the intent to admit the first students for the Spring 2004 term, or as soon thereafter as administratively possible, and shall be in effect until terminated. This Agreement may be terminated at any time by the authorities of either New Jersey Institute of Technology or Bergen Community College upon sufficient notice to allow the completion of any given applicant cycle. No further admission shall be made under this Program after such notice is given, but students already admitted into the ADHC at the time of such notice will be allowed to complete the Program at the ADHC.


