- 2. Discussed Program Summit II:
  - a. Follow up to Fall 2015 Program Summit
  - b. Deans and department chairs were invited to attend in spring 2016
    - i. Program prioritization was discussed
    - ii. LEAP Outcomes and foundational skills
- 3. Power Point: Introduction to LEAP and AAC&U. Discussion included:
  - a. Equity:
    - i. different students start in different places, adjust to each student's needs
    - ii. Even with equity, what happens if students can't do the work?
  - b. Writing Intensive Courses:
    - i. Students drop writing intensive sections, check Rate My Professor and then take a course with a professor who doesn't require writing.
    - ii. CUNY has courses in all programs (not sections) designated as writing intensive that all students are required to take.
    - iii. What is the responsibility of departments about the unevenness of course requirements?
  - c. Are all classes equal?
    - i. Academicians think all courses are equal. Students don't and may think that different courses have different values.
  - d. Correction:
    - i. Is it the responsibility of all instructors to correct grammar?
    - ii. Suggestions:
      - 1. Each week correct for a specific grammar point
      - 2. Tell students that you stop correcting after first page.
  - e. Millenials:
    - i. Does all teaching and learning have to be interactive and fun?
